Understanding and Managing Millennials and Generation Z

Just as we've gotten used to Millennials (born approximately 1981 to 1997, also known as Generation Y), a new generation has arrived on the scene. Generation Z (born 1998 and later, also known as iGen) is particularly important to the camping world, comprising the vast majority of today's campers and staff as well as future camp leaders. Lindsey Pollak, a *New York Times* bestselling author and expert on generational differences, will share her research about Generation Z and address specific ways to better recruit, retain, engage and understand the mindset and career expectations of today's young people.
